Beds are more than just a resting place for your pet – it is also a recycling and economic development project of St. Vincent de Paul of Lane County, Inc. (SVdP) The group is Lane County's largest humanitarian organization, utilizing waste-based businesses to fund charitable works.

The SVdP serves 65,000 individuals and families annually with such services as emergency and social services, as well as affordable housing and vocational services and beds themselves come out of the charity organization's sustainable waste-based business development. The beds are pet-sized real mattresses made from recovered mattress materials that are stuffed with EcoFiber – soft batts of recycled cotton. All materials are diverted from the waste stream as part of SVdP's mattress recycling operations.

Replaceable covers, made from recovered sanitized fabric, are also available for the beds – the covers are specifically sewn by local group For All Your Sewing Needs. Proceeds from all purchases helps support SVdP's charitable works.
