Support a deposit return system for reusables	\$25,000,000	\$25,000,000	Good use of funds to build low-carbon infrastructure
Workforce development	\$5,000,000	\$5,000,000	Unsure - no details given
Plastic market development	\$10,000,000	\$10,000,000	Same amount as in years past; maintains status quo
Quality incentive payments (QIPs)	\$50,000,000	\$50,000,000	Not an effective use of funds
QIPs for thermoform materials	\$40,000,000	\$40,000,000	Not an effective use of funds
